



**Dough Boy Restoration Project
Valley Park
3400 Block of Colerain
Camp Washington, Cincinnati, Ohio 45225**

Need:

The Dough Boy Statue, flag pole, and landscaping at Valley Park need revitalized to better reflect the community’s appreciation of Camp Washington residents who gave the ultimate sacrifice during military service. The 85-year old bronze statue needs restored (cleaned, patina added, sealed). The 100’ flag pole is rusted and unstable and needs to be replaced. The landscaping around the statue is overgrown and needs updated.

Background:

The Dough Boy Statue was designed and sculpted by J. Pauling (1883-1935) in Chicago, IL at the American Art Foundry in 1920. The statue represents soldiers from Camp Washington who served in the WWI, WWII, Korean & Vietnam wars. It was re-dedicated in 1988 by the Vietnam Motorcycle Club, Chapter B. According to the Sculpture Center’s 1993 Ohio Outdoor Sculpture Inventory, the 8’ high Dough Boy Statue (on an 8’ base) “would benefit from treatment.”

Estimated Costs:

1. Clean, patina and seal the Statue.....	\$6,150
Can be done on site with a scaffolding set up around the statue in May/June 2006.	
2. Replace the flag pole with a 35' pole, two flags, new base, demo and remove old 150' pole	\$2,500
Adding lights for flag pole.....	\$1,000
3. Landscaping - Re-design flower bed, add some pine trees around, weed maintenance.....	\$1,200
4. Re-dedication Ceremony & Community Festival.....	\$5,000
Music, food, games to celebrate event.	
TOTAL	\$15,850
