GO Cincinnati for Placed-Based Jobs

An exciting new development plan that focuses on creating jobs within select opportunity zones may have a huge impact on Camp Washington. The City of Cincinnati and Greater Cincinnati Chamber joined together to study ways to help the City attract new jobs in underutilized areas. In addition to 3CDC and Uptown Consortium working in Downtown, Over-the-Rhine and the Avondale area, GO Cincinnati has identified three other opportunity zones: Madison Road Corridor/I-71 in Madisonville; Reading & Seymour in Bond Hill; and, Queensgate/South Mill Creek (Camp Washington, Queensgate, and L. Price Hill).

Go to the City of Cincinnati website at <http://www.cincinnati-oh.gov> to see the study, which recommends that the Mill Creek Corridor be a regional eco-industrial zone, emphasizing green technology. This would be the first such green park in the Midwest, making it an attractive destination for jobs in the life sciences, chemical manufacturing, and professional/technical services. Total net revenue increase of GO Cincinnati is projected to be \$146 million.
