New Paving and Sidewalks for Stock Street

Our long construction *nightmare on Stock Street* is getting closer everyday to being done. New pavement, curbs, and sidewalks are nearly done. The three bioswales on the south side of the street will be installed this Spring. Final curbs on the south side will be installed after the soil settles from the 30-foot pit they dug to install the sewer pipe.

Since the new street and sidewalks are a couple feet higher than the old street, making the connection to the two alleys that connect into Stock a little tricky. A solution has been worked out, though, so we can turn our attention to planting so trees along this corridor.
