Community Board Wins PNC Housing Grant

The PNC Foundation has awarded the Camp Washington Community Board a \$15,000 housing grant. The funds will be used to provide new exterior siding to two single family homes, including a recent acquisition from the Land Bank. The Board has operated since 1975 and has completed fifty (50) housing renovations and sales to new homeowners. The PNC Foundation award will allow the Board to continue its unique mission to build up the housing stock, attract new homeowners who volunteer in the Camp community to improve the quality of life in Camp Washington.

Crosley Building Housing Presentation at April 14 Community Council Meeting

Representatives from Indianapolis-based Core Redevelopment company will present their concept for new market-rate apartments in the Crosley building on Arlington Street. Built by Powel Crowley in 1928 to produce radios and appliances (and to house the WLW 700 radio live shows), the Crosley Building is an iconic structure that has been a vacant eyesore for many years.

Core Redevelopment envisions 238 apartments in the 8-floor industrial building. They are seeking input from residents about their project, so please plan on attending this historic meeting.

YARD WASTE GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION:

Yard waste collection is a biweekly service that operations on the same green and gold schedules as the recycling program. **Monday, April 7, 2014** is the beginning of seasonal yard waste collection for residents on the **GREEN** week schedule. **Monday, April 14, 2014** is the beginning of seasonal Yard Waste collection for residents on the **GOLD** week schedule.

Residents should be reminded to use cans with lids that are clearly labeled as "Yard Waste" or paper lawn and leaf bags.

Bundles of branches and brush should be cut in lengths no longer than 48 inches and tied with cloth string.

Bags and bundles cannot exceed 40 lbs. and should be set to the curb next to their trash and recycling carts on designated green/gold collection weeks.
